## WHY GET TRAINED?

- Anyone can help prevent these deaths by knowing the signs of an opioid overdose and how to respond.
- Narcan is a safe and effective rescue medication that anyone can carry and is easy to administer.
- Narcan can reverse the effects of all opioid drugs, including fentanyl.
- The Pima County Health Department provides free Narcan to the community.
- The Good Samaritan law protects you from any liability while responding to someone with an overdose.

## TWO VERSIONS AVAILABLE:

### Overdose Response Training (45 mins.)

Teaches participants how to recognize signs of an opioid overdose and respond by administering Narcan nasal spray.

Presenters will discuss current overdose trends in our community and share valuable overdose prevention tips and resources to support PWUD.

### Harm Reduction Training (75 mins.)

Covers all the foundational information from the Overdose Response Training and expands on the concept of harm reduction and its key values as it relates to everyday life and, specifically, for people who use drugs (PWUD).
