Robles Ranch Food Bank Assistant Job Description

The position of food bank assistant requires the ability to lift and transport (using a cart) food boxes and bags to the vehicles of food bank clients, as well as accepting and stacking the delivery of food boxes and cases of food items.

Boxes may weigh up to forty + pounds. This position requires the ability to work well with members of the public. The Robles Ranch Food Bank serves approximately 250 to 300 households each month.

The assistant currently works two days a week, Tuesdays and Thursdays from 9:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.

It is possible in the future that the hours may be extended to Wednesdays from 3:00 to 6:00 p.m.

They work primarily with the food bank manager for most shifts, but on occasion may need to work independently (sick or vacation days for the food bank manager.)

As such, they are responsible for logging client visits on both a written log and electronically in the Community Food Bank's Link 2 Feed system, as well as providing and entering new client applications.

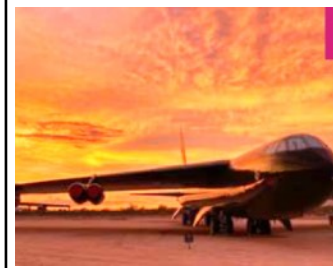
